### **Asharoken Avenue is Eaton's Neck Road – Our Only Road**

To Whom it May Concern,

The POENB represents 415 homes on the southwest side of Eaton's Neck. Collectively, over 2,000 people rely on Asharoken Avenue as the only road to their homes. Our safety and well-being is dependent on having Asharoken Avenue open for vehicular traffic at all times, regardless of weather conditions. The only way to reasonably assure this is to complete the **Asharoken Storm Damage Reduction Project (ASDRP)**.

Asharoken Avenue is the only way for Eaton's Neck residents to maintain all essential services, be it police, fire, and EMS protection; to get to the hospital, work, school, or grocery store; to get heating oil deliveries and mail; as well as all the other normal uses of a public road. Additionally, all of our necessary utilities (electric, water, telephone and cable) run above, beside, or below Asharoken Avenue and are at risk of being destroyed should Asharoken Avenue be breached. Our families are at risk of being cut off from the mainland without electricity and water, possibly for days at a time, as was the case after Hurricane Sandy. A water-main breach would cut off our drinking water supply and completely cripple the Fire Department. Additionally, should Asharoken Avenue breach, serious damage could be done to the neighboring communities of Northport and Centerport. Therefore it is critical that something be done to protect the road and all of its' associated infrastructure.

The Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) has proposed the ASDRP as a way to restore the beach in Asharoken and provide long term re-nourishment of sand. Unfortunately, the proposed requirements of public access on private properties in Asharoken as well as a very large financial commitment required of the small Village of Asharoken are threatening to stop the project. As Eaton's Neck residents, a hamlet in The Town of Huntington, we need the road protected just as much as our neighbors in Asharoken. As we see it, the public benefit of the ASDRP has to be road protection for the United States Coast Guard and our over 2,000 residents, not random public access for a few people to a restored beachfront. There already are several Public Access

Town Beaches (e.g., Hobart Beach) available in the immediate are, BUT there is only one road that services our community. We are asking that all involved parties seek ways to reduce the financial and property burdens on the Village of Asharoken to facilitate the project going forward. Without a compromise agreement based on recognizing the needs of Eaton's Neck residents, as well as Asharoken's residents, there is no way to assure the safety and well-being of over 2,000 people.

Dear Elected Officials,

Since 1947 my family has a home in Eaton's Neck. It has been a life long experience for us to live & witness first hand the gradual, perpetual degradation of our shorelines. With global warming, we have experienced a slow rising water table which through the years, has eaten up our shorelines. With the shoreline now breaching our access roadway to Eaton's Neck...Asharoken, we must now always fear when even marginal high winds are prevalent concurrently with a high tide. This condition forces us to drive through salt water spray from the Long Island sound. Then if the timing is such where a full moon high tide is joined by marginally high winds, the splash from the LIS accumulates on the roadway near the intersection of Asharoken Avenue and Bevin Road. Although we are able to pass through the salt water build up on the road way, we are nevertheless concerned with both accessibility and the degradation posing our vehicles.

The aforementioned condition is severely compounded during periods of extremely strong winds / storms and hurricanes. The Asharoken shoreline, eroded to its current configuration at the intersection near Bevin Road (LIS actually abuts existing seawall at high tide), poses us with reality... Total inaccessibility is becoming a very possible regular occurrence during storm fronts.

We need a massive build up of huge boulders to be deposited in our area of concern. This buildup must sustain the pounding of waves during periods of High-winds / Storms. The rock pile buildup should be engineered to be strategically placed at a point on the beach so as to sustain the brunt force of the pounding waves... thus averting a direct hit to the roadway...eliminating spray / water buildup on Asharoken Avenue.

I am respectfully asking that you do all that you can to encourage the NYSDEC and the ACOE to fully restore Asharoken beach which supports Asharoken Avenue in the Incorporated Village of Asharoken, Town of Huntington. The safety of the residents who live on Asharoken Avenue and the long-term protection of Asharoken Avenue are of great concern.

Asharoken Avenue allows access to Eaton's Neck (home to over 2000 people), Eaton's Neck Coast Guard Station and a Town of Huntington beach. During Hurricane Sandy many homes were damaged and the road was nearly lost. The Incorporated Village of Asharoken has approximately 310 homes (which house approximately 650 residents) and cannot carry the financial burden of the needed restoration.

The Village of Asharoken residents and the residents of Eaton's Neck are asking for full Federal and State funding for the feasibility study, as well as, the restoration project.



# Public access caveat an appalling condition

What the \$30 million beach nourishment project has done to the Village of Asharoken is sad in some ways and shameful in others.

Sad in that it is an issue that has torn the citizenry apart, neighbors screaming and flailing their arms in the faces of neighbors, residents screaming rudely at their elected officials. Shameful is that after 45 years of vague commitments and broken promises, on the eve of finally being ready to implement a substantive beach nourishment project, the federal and state governments have placed a caveat requiring public access to the beach in front of Asharoken's private waterfront homes.

This is a situation with a long complex history that dates back to the 1960s when the Northport power plant was first constructed. The plant, its jetties and its salt water intake lagoon on the west side and its coolant water discharge on the east side, have blocked the east-to-west littoral drift of sand, thus causing the erosion of Asharoken Beach in front of 247 homes to the west of the plant on the Long Island Sound.

Asharoken Village officials realized the impact that the power plant was having on their community while the plant was still being built. So, in 1974 as a stipulation to build the third and fourth units, the Long Island Lighting Company agreed to nourish the beach and to implement a sand bypass system. That is the most egregious of the broken promises.

Units three and four were built, but LILCO never lived up to its commitment to Asharoken. It took decades of litigation for the utility to agree to regularly bring sand from the east side of the plant to Asharoken beach on the west side and there was never a sand bypass system built, as had been promised.

As a result, in December 1992 a mighty nor'easter blew up the Atlantic Seaboard and breached the eroded beach, submerging Asharoken Avenue at

Bevin Road and stranding thousands of Eaton's Neck residents for days. With former Congressman Gary Ackerman and former Asharoken Mayor William Kelly leading the charge, the federal government made a commitment in the wake of the 1992 nor'easter to address the Asharoken beach erosion issue with both short-term and long-term projects.

While Mayor Kelly and Congressman Ackerman were in power, they held the government to its word. As a short-term fix a seawall was built along the Long Island Sound shoreline at Asharoken Avenue and Bevin Road and design work began on a long-term beach "renourishment" project.

The United States Army Corps of Engineers has dumped millions of dollars into the seawall, but it has had only minimal results. The sea breaches the road routinely now during severe storms and huge boulders that were supposed to hold the beach have been swallowed by the sea.

Finally, 23-years after Congressman Ackerman received the commitment from the Army Corps to come up with a long term solution, and 40 years after LILCO agreed to address the erosion problem, a \$1.5 million feasibility study was released June 30. It outlines five options for a project to replenish the beach with up to 1.6 million cubic yards of sand and with routine sand placement operations.

It is unfair and unfortunate for the people of Asharoken and Eaton's Neck that this has taken so long. And, it is also unfair that as the Asharoken Village Board contemplates which of the options is best for the community, the federal and state governments have decided that if this project is to be implemented, the beach along Asharoken from the Northport power plant to Bevin Road must become accessible to the public. That is an obnoxious condition that was sprung on the people of Asharoken and one that has caused outrage among them.

It is wrong of the federal and state governments to insist on public access as a condition of the project. It is also disheartening how some Asharoken residents have overreacted to this demand.

At an Asharoken Village Board meeting Tuesday, July 7, a woman who also owns a home on the Nissequogue River exaggerated the impact on her home from people canoeing on the river. She made it sound as if the people who canoe the Nissequogue are a notorious street gang of heroin junkies who have loud wild parties on her beach. The testimony was nonsense. Another woman said she does not want "those people" coming to her beach because she doesn't want her grandchildren exposed to needles, condoms and garbage. More nonsense.

It is unlikely that hordes of people are going to flock to Asharoken to walk along the beach after the erosion control project is completed leaving behind heroin needles, condoms and litter. Nonetheless, it is terribly misguided public policy for the federal and state governments to require public access in order to undertake this project.

Every state and federal official in this community should protest this condition and seek to have it reversed. The shoreline of Asharoken Village is privately owned, these are people's homes, and there are ample town and state bathing beaches in close proximity that can accommodate the public hankering for the shoreline.

For 40 years the people of Asharoken have faced broken promises and damaging delays. It's time to get that job done, and it's time to drop the outrageous condition of public access.

The federal and state government should live up to the commitment they made to the people of Asharoken and stop trying to extort from them an implausible demand for public access to a beach the public isn't fighting to get to.

MEMORANDUM FOR: The Record

SUBJECT: North Shore of Long Island, Asharoken, NY, Coastal Storm Risk Management Study

1. The subject study is underway and proceeding to the Tentatively Selected Plan (TSP) Milestone to obtain concurrence within U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to release the feasibility report for public and agency review. Since this project includes the proposed placement of sand for construction of a beach, the non-Federal sponsor is required to prepare a public access plan, as input into the study for both estimating real estate costs associated with the project and establishing compliance with USACE policy for cost-sharing of the proposed plan. The Village of Asharoken and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), acting as the non-Federal sponsor, submitted a public access plan, dated 18 November 2014 (enclosure 1). This Memorandum for the Record (MFR) documents the New York District (District) position on the public access plan. The upcoming TSP milestone will be used to confirm higher authority concurrence on the District position. Until this occurs, this should be considered as a tentative position.
2. USACE public access requirements are identified in Engineering Regulation (ER) 1105-2-100 and, more specifically, in ER 1165-2-130. The guidance contained in these regulations is based upon U.S.C 426e(d). The law specifically states "Shores other than public will be eligible for Federal assistance if there is benefit such as that arising from public use or from the protection of nearby public property or if the benefits to those shores are incidental to the project, and the Federal contribution to the project shall be adjusted in accordance with the degree of such benefits." The regulations that interpret this law require access plans to be developed that are consistent with the recreational use of the area, and specifically, require access points at every half mile and parking consistent with the expected recreational use.
3. The public access plan identifies the expected recreational use for the study area as low and cites existing use at comparable nearby facilities as evidence of the expected low recreational use of the area after construction. The District agrees with the non-Federal sponsor's assumption of low recreational use. Presently, the recreational use is so low as to not warrant consideration of recreational benefits attributed to the project. However, to solidify this determination, the District requests that the non-Federal sponsor expand upon the information contained in the public access plan to describe the facilities that were evaluated, the access that is allowed at these facilities (for example, are there residential restrictions on use), if the facilities are comparable to the Asharoken Long Island Sound beach, and how the determination of usage was made.
4. The public access plan identifies locations for shore perpendicular access points to the beach along the 2 mile study area. The plan identifies 3 fixed points, 1 located at the east end and 2 located at the west end of the project. The plan identifies a range of possible parcels for 2 access points in the middle of the project that could be acquired. A range of parcels have been identified, since there is uncertainty in the willingness of property owners to sell their property, and the non-Federal sponsor would like to retain flexibility in providing the necessary real estate for the project. A review of the proposed parcels indicates that plan identifies a distance greater than 3/10 of a mile over which each of these access points could be provided. While flexibility in the specific access point can be

- A. The availability of alternative transportation that would facilitate intrasite circulation. For example is it reasonable to assume that individuals could walk or use a bicycle to access the sites with no parking.
  - B. A further explanation of why expanded curb cuts are not available to provide minimal parking in these areas, in addition to a drop off location. If there is adequate space along the edge of Asharoken Avenue to provide curb cuts to facilitate drop-off locations, associated with the access points, the District would like to understand if it is possible to expand the curb cuts to provide for several parking spots or if there are reasons why this is not possible.
  - C. A further discussion of the environmental impacts, and safety impacts associated with providing parking along Asharoken Avenue. It is recognized that adjacent to Asharoken Avenue there is sensitive habitat, either in the form of dune habitat or wetlands habitat that would potentially be impacted by providing expanded parking. The access plan would benefit by providing further details on the existing site conditions that limit parking availability.
  - D. It is the District's understanding that these drop-off locations would be located along the road right of way. The District would like a better understanding of the width of the existing road right of way, to better understand the configuration of these drop-off locations, and the relationship to the adjacent properties.
7. The District requests that the non-Federal sponsor provide the additional information and assurances requested in paragraph 3 (supporting the determination of low recreational use), paragraph 4 (explicitly committing to access points every half mile), and paragraph 6 (supporting parking availability at the two points along Asharoken Avenue), as well as a commitment per paragraph 5 to obtain a specific agreement to allow for use of the parking area for beach recreation. Assuming these further details will be provided, the District would support a recommendation within USACE that the public access plan is sufficient to allow for Federal cost-sharing along the project length. As noted above, the upcoming TSP milestone will ultimately be used to confirm higher authority concurrence on the District position.
