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165 Public Hearing: Local Law #3-2024 amending chapter 86 of the code of the Village of 166 Asharoken entitled "Noise". 167 Clerk Glennon read the publication. 168 The public hearing was opened with remarks by Trustee Burke addressing the need and rationale 169 for an updated code, which was written in 1981. Four letters received in advance were summarized 170 entered into the record. 171 Residents in attendance provided the following questions and commentary, summarized as follows: 172 What was the reason for addressing this now? What drives the new ordinance? It was explained 173 that the police asked for a more enforceable code by adding an end time for music and clarifying 174 use of landscaping equipment. 175 Concern about the language in the code being unclear, specifically "reasonable person of normal 176 sensitivities." What is reasonable, particularly with the 50' foot properties. Feels fines are too 177 punitive. Concerns about enforceability. Village attorney discussed "test of reasonableness" in the 178 use of law and a discussion of decibel meters occurred. 179 The language is "Unconstitutionally Vague" Should be a provision that allows for a warning. 180 181 What is the village's role in dealing with noise disputes between neighbors; not the time to be 182 engaged in a new law. A concern was expressed about documents not being publicly available. Second sentence in 86-5-(3) should be eliminated, as too vague. 86-5-(6) should be eliminated as 183 184 well. Questioned an exemption for firearms when early morning firearms noise is a problem. Needs 185 option of warning given. Clear time parameters needed. 186 Good job on landscaping guidelines, agrees with prior speaker's comments regarding 86-5 (3) and 187 86-5-(6) Language too broad. Concern about the way code is written will prompt more phone calls 188 to police and neighbor disputes. Prefers no landscaping on Sunday. Seems everything would be 189 subject to a violation and substantial fine, the way it is written. Too arbitrary, reconsider use of 190 decibel meter to make less subjective. 191 Neighbors talking preferable to calling police. Eliminate arbitrariness and consider decibel meters. 192 Concerned about 86-5 (6) loudspeaker, noise from loudspeakers. Needs a warning written into 193 code. 194 Overall did a great job, issues with 86-5 and 6; asks for extended hours during week for home 195 landscaping. 196 Consider incentivizing electric Leaf blowers; suggest different hours for electric equipment that is 197 not so loud; decibel on property line should be considered. 198

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## **Mayors Report:**

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- 212 On February 1<sup>st</sup> I received a response from the United States Army Corps of Engineers
- answering my request that they assist the Village in redoing the seawall area. Colonel Alexander
- Young, Commander the ACOE NY District, reiterated what the Corps told the Village in 2019.
- The only way the ACOE would get involved is if the entire beach was restored from the power
- 216 plant to the seawall and that public access would be granted to the entire beach. In 2016, over
- 80% of the Village residents voiced their opposition to this plan. So, at this point, the Village
- will continue to pursue other opportunities for seawall restoration.
- The Village spent much of the month finishing the Request For Proposal (RFP) to select an
- engineering firm to make a full design of a reconstruction of the seawall and the beach in front of
- it. The RFP should be ready for distribution mid-month. Approximately 90% of the cost of the
- engineering work will be paid for by a \$1,000,000 FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant.
- The Village also work very hard with Senator Schumer, State Senator Mario Mattera and
- Assemblyman Keith Brown to get the Federal Highway Administration to release the \$1,000,000
- allocated to the Village from a Senator Schumer earmark to rebuild the most compromised area
- of the wall. I am optimistic that the Village will have a final answer in the very near future.
- The tentative assessment roll is available for review at Village Hall and on the Village website
- 228 asharoken.com.
- The holiday party at the Northport Yacht Club on Saturday January 13th was a terrific evening.
- Almost 100 Village residents had a great night socializing, dining on delicious food and dancing.
- The raffle of many exceptional prizes raised a lot of money to support the July 4th fireworks.
- 232 Trustee Laura Burke was honored for her years of service to the Village. I would like to thank
- 233 Carole Casamassima for all her hard work to make the party such an incredible success. Carole
- outdoes herself every year and is already planning next year's event.
